Course Revitalization and Refresh

Standard Course Development Process

A revitalized online course goes through an extensive process of redesign and redevelopment focused on quality standards, engaging content, and enhanced interaction, to provide learners the highest educational experience possible.

A program or department decides when an online course is ready to be revitalized. The Dean identifies a faculty member to serve as the Development Facilitator (DF). Ideally, the Development Facilitator has experience teaching the course, possesses extensive subject matter expertise, has completed the required training, and is willing to serve as the subject matter expert on the project team. Deans are the final decision-makers on which courses are revitalized, in what order and by whom.

The timeframe to revitalize a course is approximately 16 weeks of active work. Prior to the development kick-off, the Dean and Development Facilitator may work with other faculty to review the course curriculum and refine course objectives, as necessary. Following a kick-off meeting, the Development Facilitator works with the Instructional Design Specialist (IDS) and completes the Course Design
Document and Module Design Documents. The Development Facilitator provides the content to support the design elements and is responsible for coordinating any publisher content.

During the final phase, the Peer Reviewer reviews the course for adherence to QM and SPC standards and returns it to the ID Specialist. The dean has the final review and determines whether the course is ready to deliver to students.

A finalized standard course should contain components designed to engage students and increase interaction, while also meeting SPC standards and Quality Matters (QM) standards as detailed in the QM Rubric.

Rapid Course Refresh



In the 2021-22 academic year, IDEAS piloted four cohorts of Rapid Course Refresh (RCR) in an effort to provide a quicker, less intensive course improvement process. The RCR process pairs up to 10 faculty participants with an Instructional Design Specialist who will act as facilitator of a refresher course on good design, as well as providing individual consultations and guidance regarding each partipants planned updates to the chosen course. RCR starts and ends with a cohort meeting on Zoom, and the remaining course work and improvement is completed individually by the participant over 9 weeks. Compensation for Rapid Course Refresh is contingent upon the completion of class assignments as well as completed updates to the chosen course. Participation requires Dean approval of both faculty member and course to be refreshed, as well as prior completion of professional development on the process of creating courses that meet quality standards.

IDEAS is working out details for additional cohorts in the 2022-23 academic year.
