All,

As the college begins another Fall Semester, please remind faculty and staff of the following:

1. Everyone on campus should know what to do in case of an emergency.
 - Faculty should review the Emergency Response Guide (flip chart) with students at the beginning of the semester.
 - Everyone should know the primary and secondary evacuation routes from the building. The **Campus Evacuation Training Video** is available at <https://go.spcollege.edu/safety> (Campus Safety Link)
 - Everyone should know the **Shelter in Place** procedures located in the Emergency Response Guide.
 - The training video “Run, Hide, Fight” is available at <https://go.spcollege.edu/safety>. (Safety Guidelines for Active Shooter). ALICE training (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) is available on request by contacting Bill Grey or Dan Barto.
2. Faculty, staff, and students should know how to report suspicious activity or behavior.
 - Reporting suspicious behavior procedures are found in the Emergency Response Guide.
 - The **SPC Threat Assessment Plan** is located on the One College Support site under the Emergency Management Resources link. (BOT Rule 6Hx23-4.351)
 - Threat Assessment Teams are available on each campus to review activity or behavior which may pose a threat to the college.
3. Updated weather conditions and other emergency information are located under the Campus Safety link from the SPC Homepage. College wide Security will issue periodic updates on weather via email.
4. Faculty, staff, and students are encouraged to sign up for SMS text alerts by texting YES to 68453. (From My Personal Information Menu persons should verify their correct mobile numbers).
5. The **Security Alert Button (Red Siren on desktop)** should be installed in classroom bunkers. Have the faculty turn the classroom desktop computer on during class time so that the alert button is available.
6. As the COVID-19 pandemic evolves the SPC Emergency Council will continue to monitor CDC guidelines and protocols. The SPC Homepage provides a comprehensive web page with COVID-19 information and is updated periodically.
