St. Petersburg College's Curriculum Philosophy

SPC's curriculum facilitates student success by integrating *academic quality, structural consistency, articulation assurance, and student focus* into every academic program and course.

Student Centered Curriculum at SPC: Curriculum Philosophy and Model

**SPC's Curriculum Philosophy is “operationalized”
through 4 tenets:**

1. Academic Quality:

- Programs and course content are current and rigorous
- Programs and courses meet national accreditation standards and industry/professional requirements
- Student/learning expectations are clear and consistent
- Assessments align to key learning outcomes
- Document formats (e.g., syllabi) reflect professional communication standards

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2. Structural Consistency:

- Academic requirements (e.g., prerequisites) are clear and relevant
- Rigor and quality of content is consistent, regardless of delivery mode or timeframe (e.g., 16-weeks vs. 8-weeks)
- Curriculum is clearly mapped to program and student outcomes and conveys assessment points
- Supporting processes are standardized, clear, and ensure the integrity of the curriculum

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3. Articulation Assurance:

- Degree programs align to state frameworks and industry/professional requirements
- Curriculum aligns with state universities and colleges to promote seamless transferability
- Students can progress through SPC courses and programs (e.g., AS to BAS/BS) seamlessly
- Faculty collaborate within and across disciplines to reduce redundancy in curriculum and to communicate academic requirements for different programs and levels

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4. Student Focus:

- Curriculum documents (e.g., program outlines, course outlines, syllabi) conform to a standard, student-friendly format
- Student/learning expectations are clearly stated on curriculum documents
- Learning outcomes and objectives are consistent regardless of teaching mode and timeframe
- Pathways to success are clearly evident through curriculum maps
